Castleberry High School Softball Opens 2023 Season

The Lady Lions opened their 2023 season on Valentine's Day, Feb. 14. They also christened their recently remodeled softball field at the Castleberry Camp Carter Athletic Complex.

Both the CHS baseball and softball fields were renovated over this past fall. The new makeover included replacing the natural grass with artificial turf. Other changes included the addition of press boxes at both fields, new team warm up areas adjacent to the fields, as well as new sidewalks and bleachers. The updated facility certainly blends well with the other top notch athletic facilities in the district.

Unfortunately, the joyful occasion did not last long into the game itself.

The Lady Lions hosted the Lady Eagles from Crowley. Castleberry hung tough and kept it close through two innings. But Crowley broke out the bats in a big way beginning in the third inning.

Over the next three innings they scored 12 runs to deliver a 13-1 loss to the Lady Lions.

Crowley broke out on top when they scored on a CHS error and took a 1-0 lead in the top of the first inning. The Lady Lions went down quietly, three up, three down, in the bottom of the opening inning.

Neither team scored in the second

inning. The Lady Eagles then began to break the game open in the third inning.

With the aid of a CHS error, a triple, a double, and two singles, Crowley scored 3 runs. In the bottom of the third, the Lady Lions again were retired three up, three down. Score was now 4-0.

The fourth inning began rather well for the Lady Lions. CHS starting pitcher Reinah Gonzalez (#6) retired two of the first three batters she faced.

With two outs and a runner on first things were about to change. The next batter singled and was followed by a double, which scored two runs. A walk, followed by another double scored two more runs. Crowley now led 8-0.

The Lady Lions did get one run back in the bottom of the inning. First baseman Maddie Michaels (#9) smacked a hard single into right field which then got past the Lady Eagle defender. Michaels then stretched that error and poor relay throws into an inside the park home run.

The teams entered the fifth inning with Crowley leading 8-1.

The Lady Eagles took advantage of three CHS errors in the top of the fifth inning. Those errors, combined with two walks, three singles and a double resulted in five more runs for the Lady Eagles.

CHS did get a couple of singles in the bottom of the fifth, by M.Giron (#3) and I. Zuniga (#8). However, they were left stranded on first and second base.

The final score was a 13-1 victory for the Lady Eagles over our Lady Lions.

The Lady Lions will participate in another tournament Feb. 23-25 in Mansfield.

High School Seniors Impacted by Alzheimer's Encouraged to Apply for AFA's Teens for Alzheimer's Awareness Scholarship By March 1

The Alzheimer's Foundation of America (AFA) is offering scholarships of up to \$5,000 to college-bound high school seniors affected by Alzheimer's disease or other dementia-related illnesses as part of its annual Teens for Alzheimer's Awareness Scholarship.

AFA has been able to provide these scholarship funds with the generous support of charitable donors. Individuals wishing to support this and other programs and services for families affected by Alzheimer's disease can do so by visiting www.alzfdn.org/donate or calling AFA at 866-232-8484.

Entries can be submitted at www.alzfdn.org/scholarship and must be received by Wednesday, March 1 at 5 p.m. (Eastern time)

Eligible teens are invited to apply for the scholarship by submitting an essay (1,500 words maximum) or submitting a video, no more than four minutes long, describing how Alzheimer's disease has impacted their lives and what they have learned about themselves, their family and/or their community through their experience with Alzheimer's.

Examples of ways that Alzheimer's impacted a student's life can include:

- Having a loved one with Alzheimer's disease or another dementia-related illness
- Helping care for someone with Alzheimer's disease or another dementia-related illness
- Volunteering or working in a care setting that serves individuals with dementia
- Raising Alzheimer's awareness in their school or community
- Conducting Alzheimer's research


The program is open to current high school seniors living in the United States who will be attending a U.S. college or university this Fall. Students already attending college are not eligible to participate.

The top prize awarded is a \$5,000 scholarship. Additional prizes are awarded for runners up and honorable mentions. Last year, AFA awarded \$90,000 in scholarships to 117 high school students.

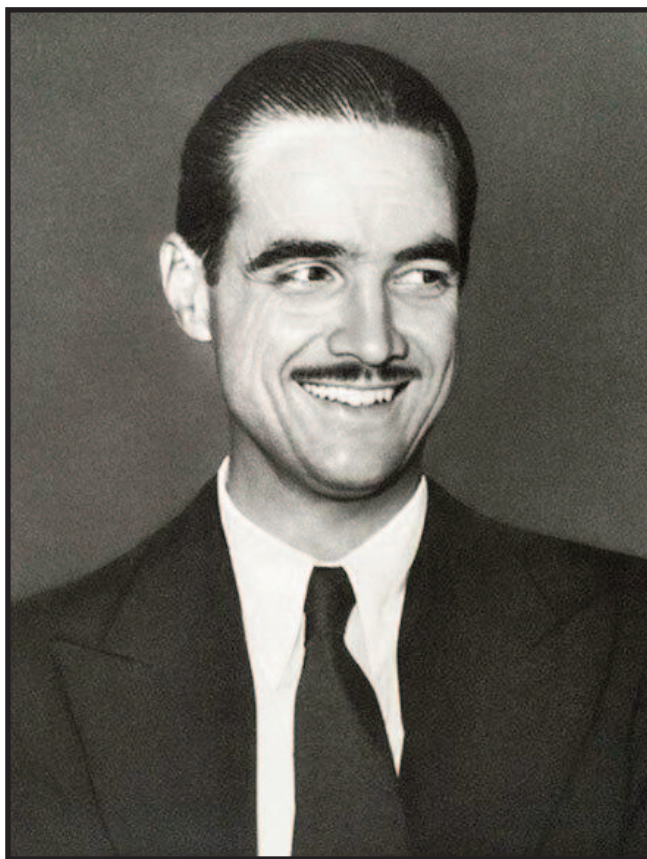

Business Magnate, Pilot, Engineer and Film Producer - Howard Hughes by Dr. Ken Bridges

Howard Hughes was a man who once commanded the world's attention, sometimes for all the wrong reasons. His story is one of wealth, power, fame, and the dangers of obsession.

Howard Robard Hughes, Jr., was born in Houston on Christmas Eve, 1905. His father, Howard R. Hughes, Sr., was a wealthy inventor and businessman. The younger Hughes likewise was fascinated by science and machinery.



By 1917, he was one of only a handful of licensed ham radio operators in Southeast Texas. He later built the first motorcycle in Houston by himself. In spite of his privileged upbringing, he faced two heart-breaking tragedies in rapid succession: his mother died in 1922, followed by his father's death in 1924.

After inheriting his father's fortune and the Hughes Tool Company, he proved very skilled at running the family business and wanted to expand. Fascinated by movies, he headed west to become a movie producer. In 1927, he began production of *Hell's Angels*, an action film taking place in World War I which included recreations of aerial dog-fights with dozens of aircraft. He learned to fly while he directed the movie, which at \$3.8 million (\$64.9 million in 2023 dollars) was the most expensive ever made up to that time.

In 1932, he founded Hughes Aircraft. Hughes himself set a speed record of 352 MPH in 1935 in his H-1 aircraft. He followed this up in 1938 with a record round-the-world flight of 91 hours. In 1939, he bought TWA Airlines for \$7 million (more than \$149 million in 2023 dollars). He continued to develop a variety of new airplanes. In World War II, Hughes Aircraft built several different types of planes for the military, many of whom Hughes himself helped design.

Though generous to friends and employees and globally famous, he became known for his obsessive attention to the smallest detail. With his aircraft designs, perfection was a necessity, often insisting on redesigns that delayed completion of projects for months. While this drive helped him become successful in movies and aviation, it steadily unraveled his personal life. For example, he would only drink orange juice he saw freshly squeezed himself or arranged peas by size. Relationships with his many girlfriends broke down quickly. In 1947, he suffered a mental breakdown, locking himself inside his personal movie theater for four months before coming out.

In 1953, he established the Howard Hughes Medical Institute

through profits from Hughes Aircraft. It would continue long after his death and eventually become the largest private research institution in the nation, spending hundreds of millions of dollars each year to research all areas of health care and medical sciences, especially genetics and cancer research.

He spent many years fighting federal regulators over his ownership of TWA and Hughes Aircraft. The federal government forced him to sell the airline in 1966 for nearly \$550 million (or \$5.1 billion in 2023 dollars). He spent the last decade of his life living in a series of hotels, having his aides run his companies by telephone and memo and avoiding any kind of public appearance. Wild rumors about his condition circulated. When he died in 1976, the once dashing figure was unrecognizable, reduced to 90 pounds with long, wiry hair and an unkempt beard.

Control of Hughes Aircraft was transferred to the medical institute as a source of funding until it was sold to General Motors in 1985 for \$5.2 billion (or \$14.7 billion in 2023 dollars). TWA did not survive, ultimately declaring bankruptcy and closing in 2001.

After his death, many books and movies about him appeared. Texas native Tommy Lee Jones portrayed Hughes in a 1977 TV movie called *The Amazing Howard Hughes*, while Jason Robards starred as Hughes in an off-beat story about one of his alleged wills making a Nevada gas station attendant a multi-millionaire in *Melvin and Howard* (1980). Leonardo DiCaprio starred in the 2004 film, *The Aviator*, which captured the early life and early mental breakdowns of Hughes.

Authors and filmmakers alike tried to unravel the complicated life of a man who had every creature comfort he ever wanted but spent so many years haunted by inner turmoil. The ultimate answers to those questions died with Hughes.

In the end, no matter how much Howard Hughes tried to ignore the world, the world could not ignore him.
