Type O Negative Blood Donors Needed For Emergencies

Crescent City Academy of White Settlement Now Open

The American Red Cross asks the public to give blood during Trauma Awareness Month in May to keep hospitals prepared for all transfusion needs, including emergencies. Type O negative blood donors are especially needed right now.

Trina Hosannah is a wife, mother of five and a grandmother of one. She has been an Early Childhood Educator for more than 20 years, providing quality childcare for children ages six weeks to 12 years.

The toddler and infants program focuses on developmental milestones through creative play and small group activities.

The hours of operation are Monday through Friday, 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. Tours are available upon request.

The Power of Type O Blood

Type O negative is the universal blood type and what emergency room personnel reach for when there is no time to determine a patient's blood type in the most serious situations.

Type O positive blood is the most used blood type because it can be transfused to Rh-positive patients of any blood type.

Red blood cells carry oxygen throughout the body and are often given to trauma and surgery patients. Type O blood donors are ideal Power Red donors, which means they can safely donate two units of red blood cells during one donation. Now, more people are able to give a **Power Red** donation – the minimum height has changed to 5'3" for female donors.

Medical traumas can quickly deplete hospital blood banks. Once patients are stabilized and their blood type is determined, they will receive a matching blood type, so it's important donors of all types give now and help save lives by downloading the Red Cross Blood Donor App, visiting RedCrossBlood.org or calling 1-800-RED CROSS (1-800-733-2767).

Cadet Captain **Jeffrey Wood** of the Civil Air Patrol's Tx-388 Phoenix Composite Squadron was presented with the Amelia Earhart Award at a CAP meeting on March 27 held at the Fort Worth Aviation Museum.

Achievement of this award requires successful completion of extensive leadership and aerospace exams, a rigorous physical fitness test and demonstration of leadership abilities including principles of officer-ship and the responsibilities of command. Approximately five percent of cadets nationwide earn the Amelia Earhart Award.

Making the presentation were squadron commander, Captain **Roman Vitanza**, and

retired Air Force Colonel **Ken Bachelor**.

After the presentation, Colonel Bachelor spoke to the cadets about his service in the Air Force and encouraged them to always pursue their dreams no matter what others may say.

Cadet Wood serves as the Phoenix Squadron's Cadet Deputy Commander of Operations. He also serves as Vice-Chair on the CAP Group VI Cadet Advisory Council where cadets work with Senior members to improve aspects of the Cadet Program.

Wood attended WSISD Fine Arts Academy from kindergarten through sixth grade before transferring to High Point Academy where he is currently a senior. After graduating this spring, his plan is to enlist in the U.S. Air Force and train in Aircraft Maintenance.

The Civil Air Patrol, the official civilian auxiliary of the Air Force, was established over 70 years ago with a three-pronged mission, to conduct search-and-rescue and disaster-relief operations, provide aerospace education to youth and the general public and operate a cadet program for teens 12 to 18 years old.

The Phoenix Composite Squadron meets weekly on Monday evenings 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. at the Fort Worth Aviation Museum located at 3300 Ross Avenue, Fort Worth, 76106.

We Need Your Help

Low hanging tree branches can delay response times of firetrucks during an emergency. These branches can also cause damage to trash trucks, school buses, firetrucks, and other large vehicles.

It is the responsibility of anyone owning, leasing, claiming, occupying, or having supervision or control of any real property to keep the trees trimmed.

Pursuant to City Ordinance if any portion of the tree or tree limbs are growing at

a height less than fourteen feet (14') above the pavement of the roadway or seven feet (7') above the pavement of the sidewalk, or if any portion of the tree or tree limbs are growing in a manner that interferes with or causes an obstruction to motorist using the roadway.

Please use a reputable trimming company, and make sure they measure the trees according to ordinance.

Top Tips to Win a College Scholarship

More than half of American families used scholarships to pay for college last year. From merit-based to artistic-focused, there are a variety of awards available.

High school senior Grace Vaughn of Trinity, Florida, knows how to successfully secure a college scholarship. After winning the \$10,000 dress grand prize in Duck brand's Stuck at Prom Scholarship Contest in 2022, Vaughn is sharing helpful tips to increase students' odds of earning funds for college:

Research, research, research

Vaughn says entering Stuck at Prom early on in high school gave her an edge on the competition. When she wasn't selected as a finalist her sophomore year, Vaughn submitted for the contest again as a junior and went on to win the \$10,000 dress grand prize.

"When I began working on my entry in 2022, I already knew how to construct the dress from Duck Tape, so I went into the process with confidence," Vaughn explains.

If you have the time and energy, she suggests applying for multiple awards to increase your chances of securing funds for school.

Leverage your creative side

Not all programs are focused on academics and athletics, so flex your creative side to win scholarships that will reward artistic abilities in drawing, painting, music and more. Beginning at an early age, Vaughn ex-

celled at visual arts and design, which is how she knew Stuck at Prom was a perfect fit for her.

"Creative awards programs are a good outlet for students to show off their talents outside of typical schoolwork," Vaughn says. "Even if you aren't crafty, scholarship applications could be a chance for you to try something new."

Make scholarships a priority

Vaughn spent 143 hours crafting her prom dress made from Duck Tape to enter Stuck at Prom.

Award Winning Author, Elmer Kelton *by Dr. Ken Bridges*

As many writers have noted, writing is the painting of a picture in another person's mind using only words. The magnificent scenery of Texas has inspired many artists and writers through the years, and the backdrop of overwhelming beauty and sometimes larger-than-life characters has often been the spark needed for a great story.

Elmer Kelton, a son of the dusty plains of West Texas, wove these elements into famous, award-winning tales of the Old West and became one of the most famous novelists in the nation.

Elmer Kelton was born in a ranch camp in eastern Andrews County simply called Horse Camp on the Five Wells Ranch in 1926. His father, Robert W. "Buck" Kelton, was a ranch hand, a man respected for his work ethic as he tried to scratch out a living for his family.

In 1929, the family moved to the small town of Crane, not far from Midland, when he father got a job with the McElroy Ranch. Sometimes the younger Kelton would work alongside his father when he was not in school. In 1942, he graduated from Crane High School.

Because he was barely 16 when he graduated in the midst of World War II, he could not enlist in the army like so many young men of the time were doing. Instead, he attended the University of Texas for a couple of years while studying journalism. After his eighteenth birthday in 1944, he enlisted in the army, serving in the infantry in Europe. Once his tour of duty ended in 1946, he returned to Austin and graduated from the university with his journalism degree in 1948.

He quickly found a job as the farm and ranch editor for the San Angelo Standard-Times. He was a popular writer and enjoyed his work. Along the way, he started writing novels about the Old West. His first, *Hot Iron*, was published in 1956. In 1957, *Buffalo Wagons* won a Spur Award from the Western Writers of America.

He produced new books at a rapid rate. Kelton even wrote for two popular television westerns. In 1958, he wrote an episode for the program *Colt .45* and wrote a 1960 episode of *Maverick* starring James Garner.

In 1963, he became editor of *Sheep and Goat Raiser Magazine*, a position he held until 1968. Continuing to write novels on the side, he then became editor of *Livestock Weekly*. He would soon



publish two more widely-acclaimed novels, "*The Day the Cowboys Quit*" (1971) and "*The Time It Never Rained*" (1973). In 1977, though his writing career had yet to reach its peak, he earned the Owen Wister Award for Lifetime Achievement from the Western Writers of America.

In 1979, "*The Good Old Boys*" was published. The novel centered on a middle-aged cowboy struggling with raising his family while pining for the adventure of life on the frontier. The book was made into television movie in 1995 and featured Tommy Lee Jones, Sam Shepard, and Sissy Spacek.

Though he steadily achieved fame for his novels, he continued to work for *Livestock Weekly* until 1990. His next-to-last novel, "*Many A River*", was published in 2009. Kelton earned his eighth Spur Award for the work.

He worked until the end. Kelton died quietly at his home in San Angelo in 2009 at the age of 83. He had just completed his sixty-second book, "*Texas Standoff*", which was released after his death. He was celebrated for his many achievements as a writer.

Today, years after his passing, his novels still have many fans.
