Brewer Player Feature: Junior Jayvion Johnson

Confidence is nearly impossible to teach in sports.

For the most part, you either have it or you don't, and apparently **Jayvion Johnson** has it.

The incoming junior was on the Brewer JV boys' basketball team this

past season and will be moving up in 2022-23.

Coach Jason Porostovsky said he likes what he sees from his incoming guard.

"JJ had a really good spring and summer," Porostovsky said. "The competition level does not change his ability to perform in games. He is fearless. He has hit big shots and isn't afraid to take them."

Porostovsky said Johnson's perseverance is one of the things that most impresses him.

"JJ's sophomore season on JV didn't go as I nor he expected," Porostovsky said. "Many factors contributed to that, but credit to JJ, he didn't give up. I have seen him grow up coming to my camps for a number of years and I knew eventually he would be able to play on the varsity team. I'm really excited to see what the regular season brings for JJ."

Johnson, 16, admitted that his sophomore season was frustrating, but said he is optimistic about 2022-23.

"I'm feeling excited about moving up to varsity next year," Johnson said. "It feels a lot better playing at the next level, and I feel like it pushes me to actually play harder. I'm also looking forward to the teammates I'll be playing with this year, because they also push me to be better."

The junior guard said the team is starting to gel as well.

From the Texas Comptroller's Office

Texas Sales Tax Holiday is Aug. 5-7

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar is reminding shoppers they can save money on clothes and school supplies during the state's sales tax holiday on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 5-7.

State law exempts sales tax on qualified items, such as clothing, footwear, school supplies and backpacks, priced below \$100, saving shoppers about \$8 on every \$100 they spend. The dates of the sales tax holiday and list of tax-exempt items are set by the Texas Legislature.

From the White Settlement Police Department

City of White Settlement Chief of Police, Christopher Cook



Christopher Cook serves as the Chief of Police for the City of White Settlement.

The White Settlement Police Department (WSPD) is accredited by the Law Enforcement Agency Best Practices Accreditation Program through the Texas Police Chief's Association. Only 186 agencies out of 2,700 across the State of Texas have achieved this gold standard of recognition. The WSPD is a full service law enforcement agency with 53 team members.

Cook retired from the Arlington Police Department as a Deputy Police Chief.

As a Police Chief, Cook has experience in overseeing federal task forces, schools, jail operations, crime scene, intelligence, criminal investigations, and patrol operations. He has managed municipal budgets in the range of millions of dollars under his commands as a police chief and deputy police chief.

Chief Cook has a wealth of experience in the public relations and traditional media management, having overseen media relations, graphic design, video production and social media. He currently serves as the President of the National Information Officers Association (NIOA),

representing the largest group of government communicators in the world.

Chief Cook was appointed as Chair for the Major Cities Chiefs Association (MCCA) – Public Information Officers (PIO) Committee in 2018, representing 78 of the largest police departments in the United States and Canada. He was also elected as General Chair for the International Association of Chiefs of Police – PIO Section from 2015-2018. Chief Cook currently serves as a Regional Vice Chair for the IACP covering Arkansas, Louisiana, Kansas, Missouri, Oklahoma and Texas.

Chief Cook testified before the President's Commission on Law Enforcement and the Administration of Justice-Community Trust and Respect for Law Enforcement panel in 2020. He also provided testimony to the IACP Police Professional Standards Ethics and Image Committee on the state of policing related to the value that public information officers provide to communities in the midst of calls for police reform and defunding media teams. Chief Cook is a veteran instructor on a multitude of topic areas. Speaking and executive training engagements include the IACP, NIOA, MCCA, FBI, Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas, Texas Crime Prevention Association, Institute for Law Enforcement Administration, Caruth Police Institute, Government Social Media Conference, the Social Media Internet Law Enforcement Conference, and numerous other law enforcement-centric organizations.

Chief Cook began his career in law enforcement in 1995 and graduated at the top of his class. Chief Cook has served as a lead planner and PIO for several large scale events, including the MLB World Series in 2011 and 2020, NFL Super Bowl in 2011, College Football Playoff National Championship in 2015, and the National Finals Rodeo in 2020.

Chief Cook holds a Master of Arts in Criminology & Criminal Justice from the University of Texas and is currently pursu-

ing a Ph.D. in Criminal Justice at Tarleton State University, a member of the Texas A&M University System.

He maintains a Master Peace Officer Certificate from the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement. Chief Cook graduated from the Institute for Law Enforcement Administration 96th School of Police Supervision in 2009, the Bill Blackwood Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas 67th Leadership Command College in 2012, and the Senior Management Institute for Police Session #63 from the Police Executive Research Forum in 2016. He is a member of the Academy of Criminal Justice Sciences, the American Society of Criminology, Texas Professional Photographers Association and the Professional Photographers of America Association.

Chief Cook received Arlington's third highest honor, a Distinguished Service Medal, in 2021 for his continued contributions to the policing profession.

He was nominated for the prestigious Gary P. Hayes Award with the Police Executive Research Forum in 2020. He received the 2018 Leadership in Public Information Management Award from the IACP. He received the 2013 Connected COPS Social Media Leadership Award for his distinguished and exemplary leadership in the use of social media.

Chief Cook has been published in several high profile journals and magazines including the IACP Police Chief Magazine, FBI Law Enforcement Bulletin, Police One, and the Academy of Criminal Justice Sciences.

Johnson said the adversity he faced last season has helped him to appreciate the opportunity he has been given this coming year.

“I know what it’s like to have to earn a spot, and I know that I’m not entitled to anything, which makes me work even harder to earn what I want,” Johnson said.

“On JV, I didn’t get much playing time even though it was the JV level and it frustrated me and it was something I had to work through during the season.

But when I got moved up to play with varsity, I expected that and it allowed me to make the best of the opportunities I was given.”

Porostovsky said he needs Johnson has been working hard to get stronger and improve his passing game this off season and said he believes the incoming junior can be an impact player.

“I think JJ has a good chance at starting this year and providing a nice scoring punch at the guard spot,” Porostovsky said.

advantage of the opportunity to save money on everything from book bags to ballpoint pens,” Hegar said. “With inflation driving prices higher on just about everything, this sales tax holiday provides Texas families some small relief managing the costs associated with kids heading back to the classroom. As the father of three school-aged children myself, I know how these expenses can add up.”

The Comptroller’s office estimates that shoppers will save \$112 million in state and local sales tax during this sales tax holiday.

- Apparel and school supplies that may be purchased tax-free are listed on the Comptroller’s website at [TexasTaxHoliday.org](https://www.texas.gov/txtaxholiday).
- During the annual sales tax holiday, qualifying items can be purchased tax free online or by telephone, mail, custom order or any other means (including in-store purchases) when either:
- the item is both delivered to, and paid for by, the customer during the exemption period; or,
 - the customer orders and pays for the item, and the seller accepts the order during the exemption period for immediate shipment, even if delivery is made after the exemption period ends.


Texas’ sales tax holiday weekend has been an annual event since 1999.

City Council Candidate Filing Period Deadline Aug. 22

The City of White Settlement General Election is scheduled for Tuesday, Nov. 8, to elect members of the Council for Place 2 and Place 3.

For candidacy filing purposes, the location of the main administrative office for the next General Election is:

City of White Settlement City Hall
Office of the City Secretary
214 Meadow Park Drive, White Settlement, TX 76108

The White Settlement Public Library, located at 8215 White Settlement Road, White Settlement, Texas 76108, will serve as an Early Voting and Election Day vote center.

Filing an Application for Place on Ballot deadline is Aug. 22, 2022. There is a \$30 filing fee for candidates filing for Council Member Place 2 and Place 3. A candidate may also file a petition in lieu of a filing fee.

Candidates must submit Form CTA to the Office of the City Secretary prior pay-

ing a filing fee. The filing fee is due at the time the application for place on the ballot is submitted.

An application filed prior to July 23, 2022 is void. Applications should be submitted timely to allow for review of requirements. All fields must be completed unless specifically marked optional.

Candidates must meet the following qualifications as set out in the City of White Settlement Charter:

- A resident of the City of White Settlement and the State of Texas and shall have been a resident for a period of not less than twelve (12) months immediately preceding his election;
- A qualified voter of the State of Texas and Tarrant County;
- Shall not be employed by the City of White Settlement;
- Shall not hold another elective governmental office;
- Shall be eighteen (18) years of age or older at the time of filing for and/or assum-

ing office;

- Shall not have been determined to be mentally incompetent by a final judgment of a court;
- Shall have not been finally convicted of a felony or misdemeanor offense involving moral turpitude from which the person had not been pardoned or otherwise released from the resulting disability.


