The Brewer boy's basketball team lost some players to graduation this past school year and fans can expect to see a few new faces leading the way for the Bears in 2024. One such player is **Nash Pena**, a sophomore that was called up from the JV squad to add strength to Brewer's perimeter game, and whom coach Jason Porostovsky said has a lot of potential.

"Nash is a good three-point shooter," Porostovsky said. "We moved him up to the varsity as a (continued on page 2)

sophomore because we needed a possible spark off the bench. Nash also has a good understanding of the game.”

Porostovksy said he had a couple of goals for Pena in 2024.

“We need Nash to sharpen his three-pointer to where it’s automatic if left open,” Porostovksy said. “We also need Nash to focus on his defensive side of the game.”

Pena, 15, said he enjoyed his first season on varsity and said he was pleased with his growth as a player.

“Overall last season was a success,” Nash said. “I believe that we definitely exceeded expectations. The outcome wasn’t what we wanted, but we progressed a great amount from the beginning of the season. My goals coming into the season were to win and see overall improvement in my game. I think both of those were accomplished, and I definitely learned a lot from the previous year of basketball.”

Pena said his main objective for next season is to go farther as a team than Brewer

did last year and said he believes the Bears toughness and shooting. have the potential to make a run.

“I’m feeling good about the future, and I’m working hard,” Pena said. “I’m trying to get in the gym almost every day to see success for this upcoming season.”

The Brewer shooting guard, who is also into fashion, said reflecting on 2023, one moment stands out to him in particular.

“I believe my favorite memory from last season was probably the first home game,” Pena said. “The environment was great and hitting a game-tying three to eventually win the game was an awesome feeling.”

Porostovksy said Pena could play an important role for the Bears next season.

“We believe Nash has a real shot at earning minutes and climbing into the rotation,” Porostovsky said. “In our offensive system, we really thrive when we have a shooter on the floor that can space the floor and open up driving lanes for others through their ability to shoot the three.”

For this off season, Porostovksy said he would like Pena to work on his defensive

# Furry Friends Can Cause Distracted Driving: Here's How to Stay Safe Behind the Wheel



Summer road trip season is here! Whether your vacation plans include national parks, sandy beaches or major metropolises, you may be thinking of bringing the entire family along, even your four-legged companions.

While we love having them near, dogs aren't always safe passengers. A recent poll commissioned by Selective Insurance, a leading home, auto and business insurance carrier, found that in the past 12 months, dogs caused a majority of drivers to be distracted on U.S. roadways.

The study, conducted online by The Harris Poll, found that of licensed drivers who recently (over the last 12 months) drove with their dogs, 91 percent admitted to interacting with them while driving, including

interactions requiring the driver to take their hands off the wheel or eyes off the road, and 48 percent acknowledged that they are more distracted when their dog is in the vehicle than when it is not.

"We love our dogs. However, some of their behaviors in the car, such as sitting on drivers' laps, jumping between seats, or sticking their heads out the window, divert drivers' attention from operating a vehicle," said Scott Smith, vice president and director of Safety Management at Selective Insurance. "To help keep our roads safe, drivers need to minimize distractions. That means our beloved pet passengers should be restrained in the back seat, and if they need tending, drivers should first pull over to a safe place."

Some of the more hazardous behaviors that drivers engaged in while recently on the road with their dog include giving them food/treats/water (36 percent), taking a photo/video of their dog (27 percent) or holding them in place (23 percent) while driving. In addition, 40 percent of drivers who have ever driven with their dog confessed to various reckless driving behaviors as a direct result of having their dog in the vehicle, including swerving out of the lane (11 percent) and hard braking (13 percent).

This summer, as you head out with your dog on journeys near and far, help minimize driving distractions in your vehicle with these tips from Selective Insurance:

- Have your dog ride in the back seat and consider using a partition between the front and back seats.

- Use a dog seatbelt, safety harness or anchored crate to prevent distractions and provide your dog with some protection if there is an accident. A significant 70 percent of licensed drivers who recently drove with their dogs say their dogs were unrestrained in the vehicle. Yet, 82 percent of drivers who recently drove with their dogs agree that having an unrestrained dog in a moving vehicle can distract the driver. Not using a restraint is risky and could put you in violation of the law. Some states have animal restraint laws for vehicles to help keep drivers safe and focused. However, only 24 percent of licensed drivers who recently drove with their dogs say they are very familiar with such laws in their state. That's compared to 34 percent who say they didn't know these laws existed.

- Plan ahead and identify rest stops along your route so you and your dog can take a break. If you need to make an unplanned stop, avoid the side of the road and instead look for a quiet parking lot. Use these occasions to give your dog food, a little exercise and most importantly in summer, plenty of water.

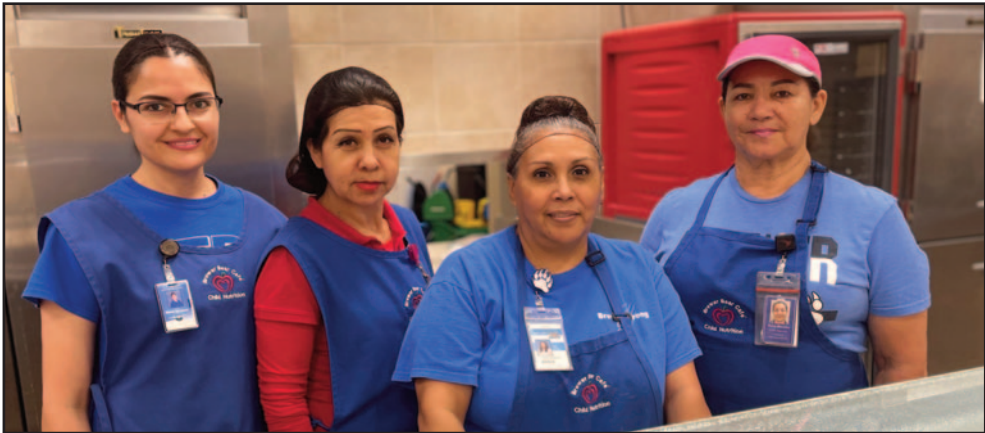
# Stormwater Drainage Project at Farmers Branch Linear Park

# Most Decorated Texan of WWI, Marcelino Serna *by Dr. Ken Bridges*

The generation that fought World War I is now gone, but their legacy of bravery continues to live on.

One of those figures was Private **Marcelino Serna** of El Paso, one of the most highly decorated men of the war. As an immigrant, he fought with uncommon bravery to defend his new home.

Serna was born in April 1896 in a mining camp in Chihuahua, one of the Mexican states bordering Texas. His family was poor, but Serna wanted a better life for himself. In 1915, determined to find work, he left his family at the age of 19. He came to El Paso in search of the American Dream. Initially, he did not speak English but was able to find work on a railroad maintenance crew. From there, he found his way to Colorado where he worked as a farm hand.

In 1917, the United States entered World War I and initiated the first draft since the Civil War. Federal officials stopped Serna in Colorado and asked his draft status. In spite of his status as a Mexican citizen, Serna, like so many other immigrants, volunteered to fight for his new country. After three weeks of basic training at Camp Funston, Kansas, he was assigned to the 335th Infantry of the 89th Division and sent to France.

In France, his unit found itself in the middle of fierce battles, some of the worst faced by American units. German assaults were relentless. Casualties were high. Serna and the men of his unit fought on. On Sept. 12, 1918, his unit was pinned down by intense machine gun fire. Twelve troops were killed. Serna volunteered to scout ahead to find a way to knock out the German positions. He crept alone until he reached the machine gun, threw four grenades at them, killing six. He captured eight others and returned to his unit. Two weeks later, he followed a German sniper to the enemy trenches and laid down fire. He killed 26 German soldiers and captured the remaining 24.

For his actions, he received the Distinguished Service Cross, the second-highest medal in the army. He was personally decorated by Gen. John J. Pershing, commander of the American Expeditionary Forces. Marshal Ferdinand Foch, commander of the French forces, awarded him the Croix de Guerre, France's highest award. The Italian army also honored him for his bravery. He was the first



Hispanic ever awarded the Distinguished Service Cross. When army officials discovered that he was a citizen of Mexico, the army offered to send him back to Mexico as a hero. Serna declined, preferring to stay with his fellow soldiers and help his adopted country fight on to final victory.

He received two Purple Hearts for injuries under fire. In November 1918, just days before the end of the war, he was shot in the legs by a German sniper. He returned home from the war as one of the most highly decorated Texans of World War I.

In May 1919, Serna was given an honorable discharge and left the army. He married in 1922, a long marriage that produced six children. He officially became a U.S. citizen in 1924. He took a series of various jobs before settling in El Paso and working at a canning factory. Not long afterward, he began working at El Paso's Fort Bliss as a civilian worker in the quartermaster's office. Some time after the opening of the William Beaumont General Hospital at Fort Bliss, Serna took a job working at the facility. He spent many years working as a plumber, still helping his fellow soldiers by keeping the hospital running, before his retirement in 1961. He remained active in his church and the local Veterans of Foreign Wars.

The only Hispanic to receive the Medal of Honor during World War I was Private David Barkley of Laredo, and one of only three Texans to be so awarded. Barkley died on Nov. 9, 1918, two days before the end of the war, when he drowned while completing a scouting mission against the German lines. He was only 19. In spite of Serna's actions and numerous efforts by politicians and community organizations, he never received the Medal of Honor during his lifetime.

Serna died at his home in El Paso in 1992 at the age of 95. He was buried with full military honors. In 1995, Texas Congressman Ron Coleman proposed legislation to posthumously award Serna with the Medal of Honor. The measure did not pass.

In 2017, however, the port of entry at Tornillo, just southeast of El Paso, was renamed in Serna's honor. Another congressional attempt to honor Serna with the Congressional Medal of Honor in 2021 failed.

In 2022, State Sen. Cesar Blanco of El Paso pushed through a measure that gave Serna the Texas Legislative Medal of Honor, one of only 16 Texans ever so honored.
