## Athlete Spotlight: Brewer Bear Baseball's Evan Laredo

Regardless of the season, Evan Laredo's major goal always remains the same—to make the playoffs.

The Brewer High School outfielder and first baseman was a first team all-district selection in 2023 and coach Gilbert Ramirez said Laredo contributes a lot on the field.

“Evan brings a sense of confidence to the team and is a great example for his teammates,” Ramirez said. “He is a hard worker and is constantly trying to grow as a player.”

Ramirez said Laredo led the Bears in hitting and was a solid defensive player in left field, and said that his objectives for the Brewer senior are two-fold.

“Our goals for Evan are for him to continue to strive to improve daily and to continue to get stronger,” Ramirez said. “We would love for him to be in contention for district Player of the Year next year.”

Laredo, 17, was very honest about his feelings about Brewer's 2023 campaign.

“I'm disappointed in how our season finished,” Laredo said. “We started of strong but fell off towards the end.”

The incoming senior added that, while it meant a lot to be selected to the all-district squad, he was not completely satisfied with his own effort this past season.

“My goal was to hit two or more home runs, have a higher batting average than my sophomore year and help the team make the playoffs,” Laredo said. “I didn't meet my goals.”

Laredo said in his spare time he likes to workout, listen to music, travel to different states and countries and watch sports and

said he has an objective when it comes to another of his hobbies.

“I would like to learn how to play golf better,” Laredo said.

Reflecting on the season as a whole, Laredo said his favorites memories involved two big wins for the Bears in district competition.

“Beating Aledo and WF Rider on their fields,” Laredo said. “No one gave us a chance, so that made it more special.”

Ramirez said he already has Laredo's work cut out for the off-season.

“Evan is a complete player,” Ramirez

said. “We would like him to add a little more strength and to help us in the pitching rotation.”

# Tarrant County's 18th Annual Back to School Roundup: Pre-Registration Deadline Friday, Aug. 4

Pre-registration is going on now through Friday, Aug. 4 for Tarrant County's Back to School Round Up.

To qualify and register for free school supplies, families must **register online**, show proof they live in Tarrant County and meet the 2022 Federal Poverty Guidelines. Listed below are ways to show proof of qualification.

Families will receive an email confirmation that they will present the day of the event to gain admission into the event.

The person who pre-registers is not required to attend Roundup. In fact, the email confirmation can be sent with any person to pick up the school supplies.

## Here's what you will need to register:

Families must show three documents along with their completed registration form to qualify for school supplies. A picture ID, proof of Tarrant County residency and proof they meet the 2023 Federal Poverty Guidelines.

## Examples of what can be used for Picture ID:

You may use any one of the following:

- Texas state driver's license
- Texas state identification card
- Military identification card
- Foreign consulate-issued identification (i.e. Matricula Consular)
- School, Employer work identification card
- Church ID card

## Examples of what can be used for Proof of Tarrant County Residency

You may use any one of the following:

- May, June, or July 2023 utility bill (electricity, water, phone or gas) showing applicant name and current address.
- Mail sent to applicant showing applicant name and current address, with a postmark from either May, June, July 2023
- Letter from landlord or apartment management company, on company letterhead, indicating proof of residency during May, June, or July 2023

## Examples of what can be used for Proof of Income

Families applying for free school supplies must meet 2023 Federal Income HHS Poverty Guidelines. You may present any of the following:

- Paycheck stubs from May, June, or July 2023
- Letter dated in May, June, or July 2023 on agency or company letterhead from an employer, welfare office, caseworker, or Social Security Administration Office indicating annual income and signed by an agent of the company or agency. Letter must include contact phone number for verification
- Letter or card showing participation or enrollment in Medicaid, SNAP, unemployment, disability or school free lunch program

Come join the fun and enjoy fellowship with the Quilt Club volunteers while you make a difference in our community by being a blessing to others.

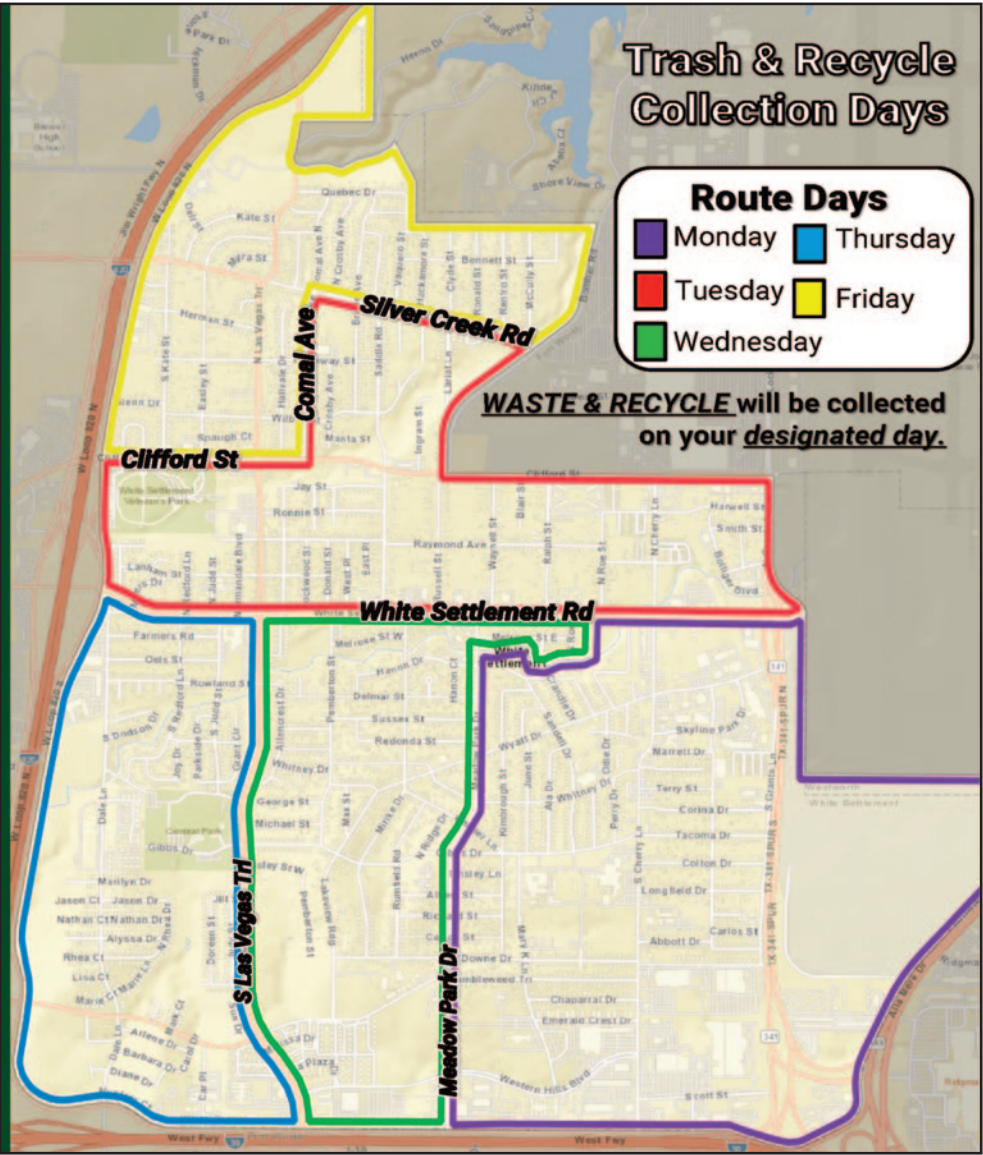

# Waste Collection Services: Trash, Recycling and Bulk Pickup

To find out your trash and recycling cart pickup day, [click here](#) for the interactive route map or consult the picture below.



Trash carts are picked up once per week. Carts can be placed out either on the street against your curb or along your curb line with wheels facing the house no earlier than 7 p.m. the night before pickup and no later than 7 a.m. the morning of pickup.

Carts must have at least three feet of space on each side, and be returned behind the front build line of your home by 7 am the day following your pickup. Please make reasonable efforts to store your carts out of sight, but at a minimum they must be behind the front build line of your structure. Trash in your trash cart should be bagged, not loose.

## Recycling

Recycling carts are picked up once per week on the same day as your trash cart. Recycling cart placement regulations are the same as those listed above for trash carts. Recyclables in your recycling cart should be loose, not bagged. Please rinse cans, bottles, and containers and make sure they do not contain food waste before adding them to your recycling cart.

Recyclable materials accepted are: cardboard, boxboard (beverage boxes, frozen food boxes, cereal boxes, milk containers), newspaper, junk mail, envelopes, magazines, brochures, file folders, plastic containers identified with #1 , #2, #3 , #5 , #7 · glass bottles and jars colored amber, clear, green, aluminum beverage

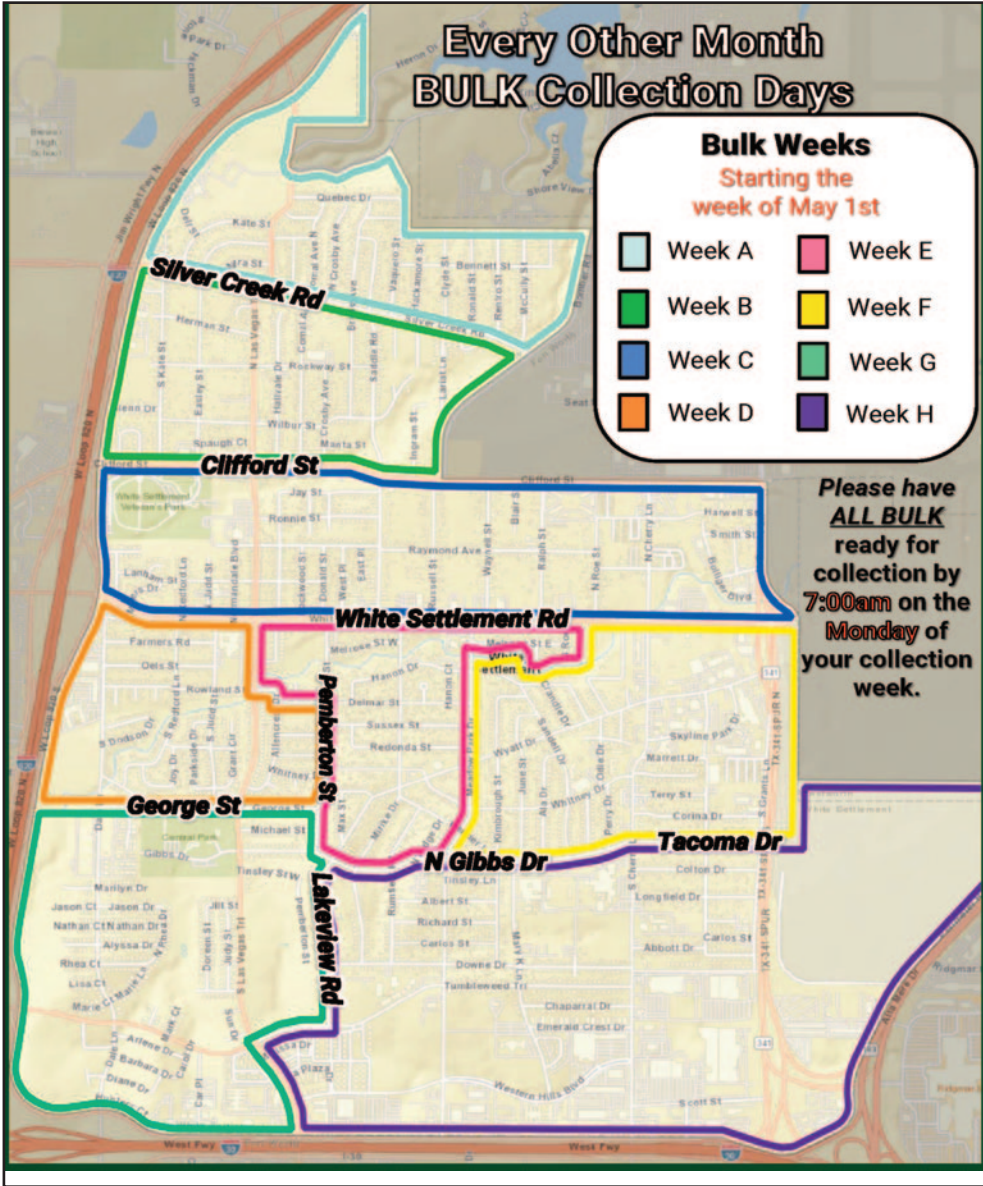
cans and steel and tin food cans.

## Bulk Pickup

Curbside bulk pickup will take place every other month. Bulk piles can be seven cubic yards in size, or about eight feet long, six feet deep, and four feet tall. For reference, the new trash carts are about one cubic yard in size, meaning an acceptable bulk pile would be about seven carts large. The placement period for curbside bulk is the weekend prior to your bulk pickup week and should be placed along the front yard curb line away from obstructions like mailboxes, fences, trees, or parked vehicles. Bulk piles can contain limbs or bundles of limbs that are cut to three feet in length, brush, yard waste, furniture, appliances without refrigerant, and debris from small home improvement projects. Bulk piles cannot contain tires, household hazardous waste, electronics, garbage, construction debris, batteries, medical waste, gasoline, and car parts.

If you’ve got extra bulk, there are some great options for you. The monthly Community Clean Up events provide a great opportunity each month to drop off your bulk items. You can also contact Frontier Waste Solutions directly to request an additional bulk pickup for just \$15 per cubic yard.

# Professional Golfer, Byron Nelson

Texan **Byron Nelson** was a legend in sports.

In the 1940s, he was the most successful golfer in the world, never losing his faith or his modesty.

John Byron Nelson, Jr., was born in Waxahachie in 1912 to a hard-working family of devoted churchgoers.

In the 1920s, the family moved to Fort Worth, where Nelson soon found work as a golf caddy at Glen Garden Country Club. He fell in love with golf, even playing in the dark of night. Here he met Ben Hogan, also a young caddy and also one of the future legends of the game.

Nelson turned professional in 1932 and took a number of jobs across the country running several golf clubs as head professional. His first tournament win was the 1935 New Jersey State Open. In 1937, he won The Masters Tournament, his first major championship win.

He had 21 professional wins before World War II erupted. While many other athletes served in the war, Nelson’s hemophilia prevented him from serving. Nevertheless, he continued to play on the PGA Tour and worked to raise money for the war effort. He defeated his old friend Ben Hogan in a dramatic playoff in the 1942 Masters Tournament. The war caused most professional athletics to shut down for 1943, but Nelson came roaring back in 1944, winning eight tournaments in the shortened season.

In 1945, Nelson won 11 straight tournaments, thrilling sports fans. The winning streak set a record which has lasted for decades. He won his fifth and last major, the PGA Championship, in 1945. He won a total of 18 tournaments that year. The Associated Press would also name him its Male Athlete of the Year for 1944 and 1945. He went on to win six more tournaments in 1946 and finished in the Top 20 for 113 straight tournaments.

After the 1946 season, Nelson largely retired from golf after having won 64 tournaments. He continued to play in The Masters until 1966 and played on the American team for the Ryder Cup international tournament in 1947. His last tournament win was the 1955 French Open.

After retiring from golf, a move he said he never regretted, he fulfilled his dream of buying his own ranch. He was content to



work on his ranch outside Roanoke for the rest of his life. A humble man of faith, he continued to serve his church regularly, even serving as a janitor for the church on occasion.

Long after his retirement, Nelson remained a beloved figure by golf fans around the world. He helped coach and advise many young players struggling to find success on the PGA Tour and worked as an analyst for televised golf tournaments.

He also worked with children to help them learn golf and develop Nelson’s same love for the game. In 1968, the PGA Tour renamed its Dallas tournament after Nelson.

For years, the Byron Nelson Classic was the only tournament named after a player. He was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 1974. The PGA also gave him its Lifetime Achievement Award in 1997.

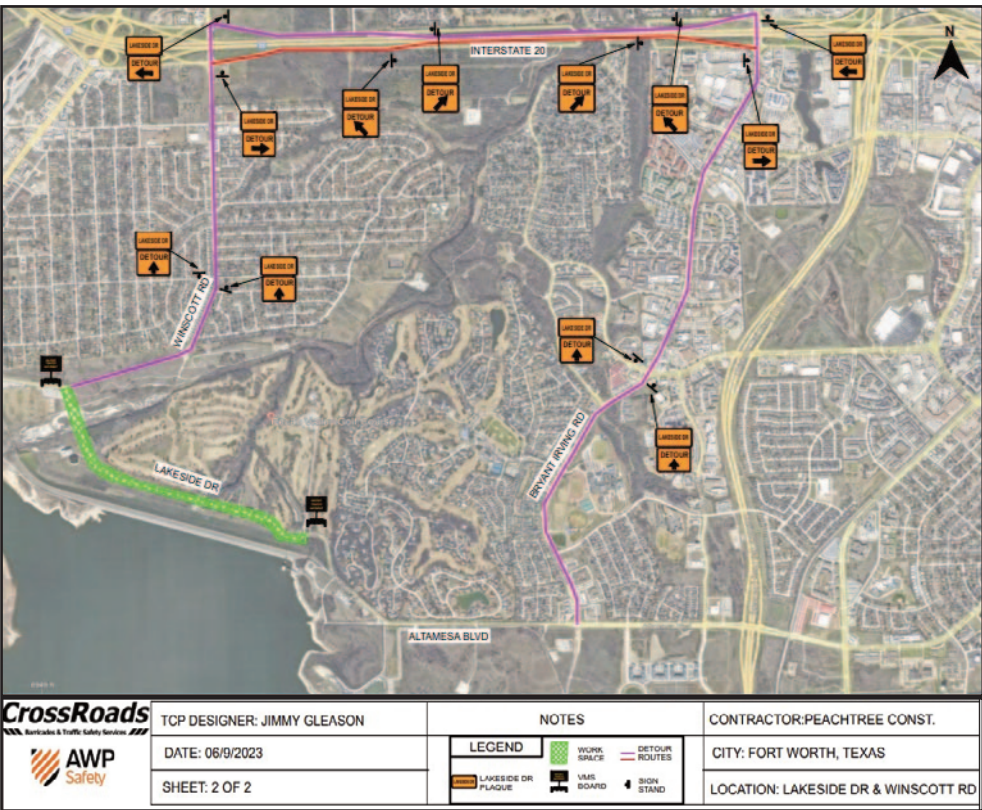
## Lakeside Drive Repaving Project
